HOW CAN I HELP LOS RANCHOS HARVEST OPPORTUNITY?

WHAT IS LEDA LOGRT?

Q: What is LEDA LOGRT?

A: It's a small local tax (1/4-cent on every \$1) that funds projects under the Local Economic Development Act—supporting local business, culture, and infrastructure.

Q: Why does Los Ranchos need this?

A: It gives the Village tools to invest in local businesses, improve infrastructure, and strengthen community spaces while keeping funds under local control.

Q: Has this been used elsewhere?

A: Yes, many New Mexico communities, including Clovis, Alamogordo, Portales, and Los Alamos, have public meeting processes. used LEDA to grow their local economies.



HOW IT WORKS

Q: How much is the tax?

A: 1¢ for every \$4 spent.

Q: How much money will it raise?

A: About \$485,000 per year, based on current business activity.

Q: Where does the money go?

A: Into a state-required special fund used only for economic development projects.

Q: Who decides how it's spent?

A: The Village's Board of Trustees through open and

Q: What kinds of projects will benefit?

A: Fourth Street upgrades, improvements to local farms, local small business support, and community anchors like the Agri-Nature Center or Del Norte Open Space.
